

RACING TO PROFIT: FREE REPORT

What is it?

What follows is a look at five jumps trainers who have traditionally done well in September and October. I have tried to focus on a handful of 'positive pointers' for each trainer. There is also a more in-depth look at one of them and a micro angle that may be worth keeping onside beyond October.

Sadly history is no guarantee of future success and profits can never be guaranteed. With any luck these angles will throw up a few winners for us all to celebrate but we shall see. I would tread with some caution as we are always dealing with small enough sample sizes.. I could do with a change in fortune on the micro angle front as it has been quite a struggle for most of this year. Hopefully these five can provide some cheer.

Anyway, that's enough waffle, let's jump straight in...

Who should we keep an eye on this September/October?

So...

- National Hunt
- September/October
- 2013,14,15

Let's just look at those with 25+ points to SP profit over the last three years...

Let's take a closer look...

Mrs Rose Dobbin

Maybe not as good as those top figures suggest. 3/29, 10 places last year, for a loss of 16 points. Her stats also include two 28/1 winners which boost the stats somewhat. But, she may have another this year.

Positives

- 4/1 or shorter SP: 21 bets / 8 wins / 11 places / 38% sr / +13 SP / +14 BFSP / AE 1.42
 - 9/2-16/1: 2/48, 12 places... -24 SP... AE 0.35
 - 18/1- 40/1 : 9 bets / 3 wins / 4 places / 33% sr / +70 SP / +86 BFSP / AE 9.68
 - Over 40/1: 0/6, 0 places
- Kelso: 16 bets / 5 wins / 9 places / 31% sr / +69 SP / +90 BFSP / AE 2.33
 - Sedgefield: 17 bets / 3 wins / 6 places / 18% sr / +15 SP / +18 BFSP / AE 1.11
 - Ayr: 0/9, 0 places
- Dropping 1 class: 19 bets / 4 wins / 7 places / 21% sr / +39 SP / +52 BFSP / AE 1.45
- Class 5: 26 bets / 6 wins / 9 places / 23% sr / +64 SP / +85 BFSP / AE 1.73
- 11-8 or more: (handicaps): 16 bets / 6 wins / 8 places / 38% sr / +25 SP / +33 BFSP / AE 2.31

J P L Ewart

Positives

- All Handicaps: 22 bets / 9 wins / 11 places / 41% sr / +34 SP / +39 BFSP / AE 2.39

And that is it for him. Small numbers but any of his handicappers running in the next two months are worth close scrutiny.

Miss E C Lavelle

Positives

- 1+ run in last 90 days: 41 bets / 13 wins / 24 places / 32% sr / +64 SP / +94 BFSP / AE 1.82
 - 0 runs: 75 bets / 14 wins / 31 places / 19% sr / -14 SP / -10 BFSP / AE 0.88
- 1-5 career runs: 34 bets / 11 wins / 15 places / 32% sr / +34 SP / +42 BFSP / AE 1.78
- October (all runners): 86 bets / 22 wins / 44 places / 26% sr / +25 SP / +36 BFSP / AE 1.26

Micro Angle

Some caution is advised with Emma Lavelle as she has recently moved yards I believe (in May maybe) after a few years in the doldrums. She has always struggled for consistency for as long as I can remember, especially as the season would progress. She used to do well in the Sept-November period but even this was a bit underwhelming last season.

This change of yard could mean that all previous stats go out the window but if recent form is anything to go by this change may have had the desirable effect.

You would have lost a lot of money (between 40-70 points a year) if backing all of her runners during 2013/14/15 but her overall stats for 2016 so far, all runners, all odds...

97 bets / 16 wins / 32 places / 16% sr / +32 SP / +63 BFSP / AE 1.39

The Actual vs Expected in the previous three years: 0.78, 0.7, 0.78...so, having gone from performing below what the market would expect based on the horses' starting price, the runners are now doing better than what the market expects. That is a positive turnaround.

2016... up to the end of March: 1/32, 6 places... -26

Since the start April... 15/65, 26 places...+58 SP... and in July/August... 8/20, 13 places.

ODDS

Lavelle has winners up to 22/1 and may have one go in at bigger odds at some point but those priced 25/1 or over since start 2013, all runners... 0/62, 4 places.

There are three race areas where, even despite the inconsistency, Lavelle has done well. That is where I want to focus. This is simple, but could be worth keeping an eye on...

- Emma Lavelle
- 2013- (every month)
- 22/1 or shorter SP
- Maiden Hurdles / Handicap Novice Chases + Handicap Novice Hurdles

By race type:-

These are the only race types where you can profit in this way. All other race types would need a bit more digging. Sometimes simple is best and I will be keeping a close eye on these runners. In general these race types are dealing with young/unexposed horses so as well as any trainer form being a concern, there is also the 'type' of horse in the yard/success at the sales etc. A poor restocking of the yard can impact on races such as this along with any change in training approach.

2016 to date gives hope that all is well on both these fronts.

So, we have the three 'positives' for the September/October period and then we also have these three race types.

Hopefully these starting points will be useful, albeit ALL of her runners could be worth a second glance at the moment.

Nigel Twiston-Davies

My good racing friend Ben Aitken (narrowingthefield) has always done superb work on 'Twister Season' and I think his angles are still profitable. You would expect the market to cotton on at some point but so far the profits keep coming. Backing all of his runners in the Sept-Oct period is no bad starting point, but it is a lot of bets and results may be dependent on the odd juicy price winner.

Let's see if I can narrow it down...

Positives

- All winners 20/1 or shorter... 48/210,94 places.. 23% sr...+73 SP...AE 1.12
 - Over 20/1 SP: 0/14, 0 places
- 1 run in last 90 days: 57 bets / 15 wins / 26 places / 26% sr / +40 SP / +50 BFSP / AE 1.61
- Ran 21-60 days ago: 55 bets / 17 wins / 30 places / 31% sr / +72 SP / +89 BFSP / AE 1.95
 - (plenty of crossover between those two I suspect)
- Handicaps .. Weight...The 'extremes'...
 - 10-00 – 10-1 weight on back (exc claims): 5/6,6 places...+36 SP
 - 11-10 or more: 10/25,13 places...+42 SP
 - The two 'extremes' combined
 - 31 bets / 15 wins / 19 places / 48% sr / +77 SP / +89 BFSP / AE 2.48

I think there are a few areas to attack there. NTD clearly has winners outside of these areas and we know he can ready a horse after a break of 90 days or more...but everyone appears to know about that and while profitable there are many bets and the projected value moving forwards (the AE figure) isn't much to shout home about. (26/120, 48 places...+10 SP, AE 1.04)

IF that handful of angles above could generate 20-30 points profit over the next two months, I think I would take that. Here's hoping.

On closer inspection, October may be the place to focus...

- September: 9/50, 20 places... -24 SP
- October: 27/103, 42 places... 26% sr... +82 SP,
 - As a month this stands out albeit there is no monthly pattern as such

Let's have a look at October only...

Positives

- Handicap Hurdles: 8/27, 9 places...+74 SP (inc 40/1 winner)
 - Handicap Chase: 4/25, 9 places... -11 SP
- Class 1,2 and 3 ONLY: 49 bets / 15 wins / 19 places / 31% sr / +94 SP / +154 BFSP /AE 2.06
 - Handicap Chase (excl handicap Novice chase) : 0/11, 1 place within this
- NO previous run, OR Top 3 last time out...
 - 58 bets / 21 wins / 31 places / 36% sr / +89 SP / +148 BFSP / AE 1.8

Some useful pointers for Evan Williams there. The 40/1 win of Court Minstrel somewhat skews the odd stat but importantly the profit figures are very respectable when you remove him. And, you never know, there may be another biggie this year.

Right, that will do for this free report. Hopefully these five trainers can give us some joy in the next two months. I will do my best to post various 'qualifiers' and 'pointers' on the free daily blog posts. I will also be keeping a close eye on the Emma Lavelle micro angle throughout the season.
